SIS30413 Certificate III in Outdoor Recreation

Abstract

Overview

This qualification is part of the Sport, Fitness and Recreation Training Package. It provides the skills and knowledge for an individual to be **competent in guiding** outdoor recreation activities in a controlled environment. It requires technical knowledge of the outdoor recreation activity to be transferred to allow individuals to safely participate in the outdoor activity. It does not provide the skills and knowledge to impart the required level of technical knowledge and expertise to allow participants to independently undertake outdoor recreation activities.

These are the potential roles in Outdoor Recreation for a graduate in SIS30413 Certificate III in Outdoor Recreation:

- Outdoor Adventure Leader
- Adventure Guide
- Outdoor Education Leader
- Operations Assistant Manager
- Activity Instructor
- Customer Service in an outdoor recreation retail outlet or tourist equipment hire company

Duration

As a self paced flexible learning option SIS30413 Certificate III in Outdoor Recreation will take approximately 12-24 months to complete. For participants with Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation or prior experience in one of the employment roles above or similar, duration may be less the 12-24 months to complete.

Learning Options

As a self paced learning option, the theory for SIS30413 Certificate III in Outdoor Recreation units can be completed via handbooks emailed directly to you or via our online Learning Management System. Practical training and assessment in the elective units is delivered face to face in one of several locations throughout Queensland, please ask about your closet training location before enrolling.

Students new to the industry and those without current (last 3 years) guiding skills are required to gain experience in 'Guiding' or 'Instructing' each of their elective activities and log the required hours as outlined below as part of their practical assessment.

Abseiling 50 hours	Kayaking 30 hours
Climbing 50 hours	High Ropes 30 hours
Canoeing 30 hours	Mt Biking 30 hours

TOEC can help the student arrange work experience by providing contact details and an introduction to several outdoor recreation providers on the Sunshine Coast and surrounding regions so they can gain experience in 'Guiding' or 'Instructing'.



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Units

There are 24 units to complete, 12 core units and 12 elective units in the SIS30413 Certificate III in Outdoor Recreation.

The elective units make up an activity such as abseiling, canoeing and so on. In the list below you can see there are 5 units that make up the activity, 'Abseiling Guide Single Pitch Artificial Surfaces.' The 5 units are:

- SISOABA302A Apply single pitch abseiling skills on artificial surfaces
- SISOABA303A Establish ropes for abseiling on artificial surfaces
- SISOABA304A Guide abseiling on single pitch artificial surfaces
- SISOABN202A Safeguard an abseiler using a single rope belay system
- SISOVTR301A Perform vertical rescues

If you choose Abseiling Guide Single Pitch Artificial Surfaces you will have 7 elective units left out of 12 to choose. A student must choose at least 2 activities and complete all the units associated with that activity, unless it is repeated in the second activity. If there are not a total of 12 units in the 2 elective units you have chosen, then you may choose units from other activities.

You do not have to complete all the units in your third or fourth choice of activity but there are units that are recommended you complete to achieve the full skills and knowledge associated with that activity. If we use the example above, it is recommended that if you choose 'Guide abseiling on single pitch artificial surfaces' as one of your electives that you also complete, 'Establish ropes for abseiling on artificial surfaces' and 'Safeguard an abseiler using a single rope belay system.' Your trainer can help you with the selection of your elective units when you enrol.

First Aid

*HLTAID003 Provide first aid' is a prerequisite to any practical training. The student may use any first aid provider to complete this training. The student must provide a copy of their current first aid certificate before they commencing practical training. The student will receive a credit transfer for 'HLTAID003 Provide first aid'.

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Funding

SIS30413 Certificate III in outdoor recreation also attracts the following funding. Participants need to meet the criteria to be eligible for funding, this is listed below. If you believe you are eligible for any of the funding, please let us now before enrolling. If you are interested in the User Choice funding, use the link to find out more about traineeships and contact an Apprenticeship and Traineeship Centre.

Training Plan and Record of Participation in Training

Students are required to sign a Training Plan and Record of Participation in Training document. This document will be used to identify the students start and finish date for each unit as well as their attendance at training, workplace visits and training completed via skype support. This document must be agreed to and signed before commencement of training or within 14 days of enrolling.



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1. Certificate 3 Guarantee (C3G)

The Certificate 3 Guarantee provides eligible individuals with access to a subsidised training place in an Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) certificate III level qualification in SIS30413 Certificate III in outdoor recreation.

Who is eligible to receive funding?

Criteria

To be eligible to enrol in the Certificate 3 Guarantee, prospective students must:

- be aged 15 years or older
- be no longer at school (with the exception of school students in Years 10, 11 and 12 undertaking a VET in School (VETiS) program — see the VETiS abstract for more information)
- permanently reside in Queensland
- be an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident (includes humanitarian entrant), temporary resident with the necessary visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen
- not hold, and not be enrolled in, a certificate III or higher-level qualification, not including qualifications completed at school and foundation skills training.

You can only access funding at a certificate III level once, not including qualifications completed at high school, so it is important that you take the time to carefully consider your training options. Refer to the following student fact sheet.

Student contribution fees

There are student contribution fees for the C3G funding. Student contribution fees are the non-government contribution to the cost of training and assessment services provided by TOEC and is mandated by the Department of Education and Training. Fees are outlined in the course structure above. Students applying for the concessional rate of funding, must provide a copy of a current concession card such as:

- a) Dept. of Veterans' Affairs / Pensioner Concession Card
- b) Health Care Card
- c) Commonwealth Seniors Health Card
- d) Disability card/documentation

2. User Choice

The User Choice program works in conjunction with the Commonwealth Australian Apprenticeships System, under which apprentices and trainees (also known in some jurisdictions as 'Australian apprentices') enter into legally binding training contracts with their employers and receive structured training to achieve a nationally recognised qualification.

The User Choice 2017–2020 program provides a public funding contribution towards the cost of training and assessment for eligible Queensland apprentices and trainees. 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Who is eligible to receive funding?

Criteria

To be eligible to receive a government contribution, the apprentice or trainee must:

- have entered into a Training Contract with an employer
- be registered with an Apprenticeship and Traineeship Centre

The government contribution will be detailed in the apprentice or trainee's Letter of Registration from the department.

Student contribution fees

There are student contribution fees as a trainee. Student contribution fees are the non-government contribution to the cost of training and assessment services provided by TOEC and is mandated by the Department of Education and Training. The student contribution fee is calculated at a rate of \$1.60 per nominal hour for each unit of competency.

Partial exemption — tuition fees

Participants who fall into one or more of the following categories will only be charged 40 per cent of the student contribution fee:

- a) The participant was or will be under 17 years of age at the end of February in the year in which the PQS provides training, and the participant is not at school and has not completed year 12.
- b) The participant holds a Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card issued under Commonwealth law, or is the partner or a dependant of a person who holds a Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, and is named on the card.
- c) The participant issues the PQS with an official form under Commonwealth law confirming that the participant, his or her partner or the person of whom the participant is a dependant, is entitled to concessions under a Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card.
- d) The participant is an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person. Acceptable evidence is as stated on the Training Contract and AVETMISS VET Enrolment Form.
